The version you get through this new link is actually the third edition of the Fast Gwada Guide. The e-book was updated recently (February 2017) - this version is a little longer than the previous one, as it has some extended sections. This means that the page's value has dropped to 22 cents. I can assure you that this guidebook is worth it \$15 cost as you will save a lot of time and money in Guadeloupe with it. Here's a handy map of the continent of Guada and all the outer islands that we've drawn for my e-book. As you can see, Grande Terre and Basse Term form the wings of butterfly island. If you're looking for a detailed offline card to download to your phone or tablet before you travel, check out the free cards at . One of my favorite places in Guadeloupe is Ilet Caret. It is a tiny sandy shore in the middle of the Caribbean Sea that has really clean water and a couple of palm trees. Heaven on earth! It is also a popular place for locals to park their private boats and have an island party. If you go there on weekends, you can see over 30 boats parked on all sides of the island and you will hear a cacophony of music around you. So if it's not your scene, you should go within a week when it's more quiet. I have visited it four times now and can't wait to go back. Love it! Unfortunately, it looks like Ilet Caret has taken a turn for the worse since my last visit about six months ago according to a recent Franco-language news article. The island is disappearing, and it's happening even faster than anyone thought! Take a look at the new aerial photo published in the article. Sad, isn't??! It? Does this mean that Ilet Caret is no longer worth attending? Of course not. Just the opposite - it means it's time to visit now, since we never know how long we will have this island of beauty in our life Gwada. And even if almost all palm trees have fallen victim to waves and rising seas, the white sand of the island and pure turquoise water still remain. If you are coming to Guadeloupe with cheap Norwegian Air flights, I highly recommend keeping in mind Ilet Caret. Visiting it makes for a really fun day out! One of the easiest ways to visit the island is to arrange a day boat trip from St. Rose, Bass Terre, or to go there from Marina Bas du Fort aboard the King Papyrus catamaran. Anyway, go before it's too late! I suspect that sooner or later, Ilet Caret will suffer the same fate as Ilet la Biche (pictured below). From this islet only this wooden shack remains on top of the water. It's still an interesting place to visit by kayak or boat, but it's not quite as picturesque as Caret Island. If you want more information about Ilet Caret and Ilet la Biche and how to visit them, my new e-book, The Guide to Rapid Guada, contains detailed information (along with 60 pages of information about Guadeloupe).
